

Management commentary

In November, markets fluctuated, initially focusing on the results of major technology companies, then on changing expectations regarding interest rate cuts by the US Federal Reserve. Short-term concerns about the earnings of major technology companies, particularly Nvidia and AI in general, precipitated a decline in equities and a slight widening of credit spreads. At the same time, several US data releases complicated the timing of rate cuts, prompting investors to push back their expectations of monetary easing by the Fed and briefly increase their risk aversion.

The impact on credit was measurable but limited: Spreads widened compared to intra-monthly levels and yields rose slightly, but new issues continued to attract demand and order books remained satisfactory. The narrative shifted again over the past week as markets began to price in a greater likelihood of a Fed rate cut in December, easing some of the pressure on risk assets; credit spreads recouped much of the widening seen in the middle of the month. It is important to note that, despite the scale of the issues, the market absorbed the supply without any lasting disruption, reflecting strong real demand and technical support that prevented the issues from becoming a structural weakness for spreads. Ultimately, the market proved resilient to shocks linked to current events and quickly recovered when political expectations became favourable.


In Europe, the ECB does not seem to be in any hurry to change its policy. Against this backdrop, investors continued to inject liquidity into the credit market, recording another month of strong inflows. These favourable conditions also prompted a number of issuers to enter the market and pre-finance before 2026. The month began with near-record new issues flooding the market during the first full weeks of November (only one week saw an unusually high number of transactions), and a succession of benchmark transactions quickly pushed monthly volumes higher, making November the second busiest month of 2025, with €108.2 billion, and bringing issues since the beginning of the year to €853.2 billion, significantly higher than the previous year. The technical capacity of the market was therefore exploited on a large scale, which was the defining theme of November.

Despite strong supply, the average spread widened by 6 bps, producing a yield surplus of -11 basis points and bringing the yield surplus since the beginning of the year to +203 bps. The overall total return for November was -24 bps. The most resilient sectors were automotive and insurance, while pharmaceuticals and chemicals underperformed. Among high-beta assets, corporate hybrids posted a total return of -0.07% over the period, high-yield securities +0.07% and AT1 +0.13%.

This portfolio is benchmarked on the Bloomberg MSCI Global Corporate ESG Sustainability SRI 1-5 Year index. We minimise relative sensitivity exposure between the portfolio and its index by investing on a limited number of securities to ensure minimal risk. Performance differences between the index and portfolio could be due to the swing price.




