#### Objectives and Investment Policy

To achieve a combination of income and capital growth (total return). Specifically, the Sub-Fund seeks to outperform (after applicable fees) the Bloomberg Barclays EGILB All Markets index over the recommended holding period.

The Sub-Fund invests at least 67% of assets in bonds indexed to European inflation and/or inflation in any member state of the Eurozone. These bonds are issued or guaranteed by any European Union member state or public entities, or issued by private issuers that are headquartered, or do substantial business, in a member state of the European Union. At least 67% of the assets of the Sub-Fund are invested in bonds that are issued in euro in the Eurozone.

The Sub-Fund makes use of derivatives to reduce various risks and for efficient portfolio management.

The Sub-Fund does not aim to replicate the reference indicator and may therefore significantly deviate from it.

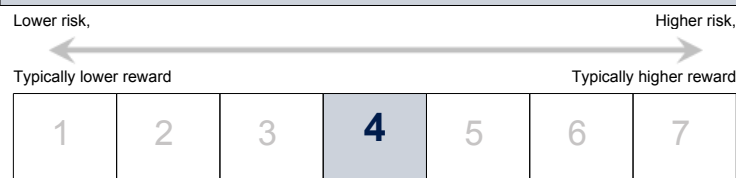
The investment team analyses interest rates and economic trends (top-down) to build its expectations for real interest rates and inflation rates. The investment team then uses both technical and fundamental analysis to select issuers and securities (bottom-up) and implement arbitrages between indexed and fixed-rate bonds.

The accumulation share automatically retains, and re-invests, net investment incomes within the Sub-Fund when the distribution share pays dividends in September of each year.

The minimum recommended holding term is 3 years.

Shares may be sold or redeemed (and/or converted) on any dealing day (except otherwise stated in the prospectus) at the respective dealing price (net asset value) in accordance with the articles of incorporation. Further details are provided in the prospectus of the UCITS.

#### Risk and Reward Profile



The risk level of this Sub-Fund mainly reflects the market risk arising from inflation-linked bonds in which it is invested.

Important risks materially relevant to the Sub-Fund which are not adequately captured by the indicator:

- Counterparty risk: represents the risk of default of a market participant to fulfil its contractual obligations vis-à-vis your portfolio.

## Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Sub-Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

<b>Performance fee</b>	20.00% a year of any returns the Sub-Fund achieves above Bloomberg Barclays EGILB All Markets. Over the last accounting year, a performance fee of 0.11% was charged.
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The **entry** and **conversion charges** shown are maximum figures. In some cases you might pay less - you can find this out from your financial adviser.

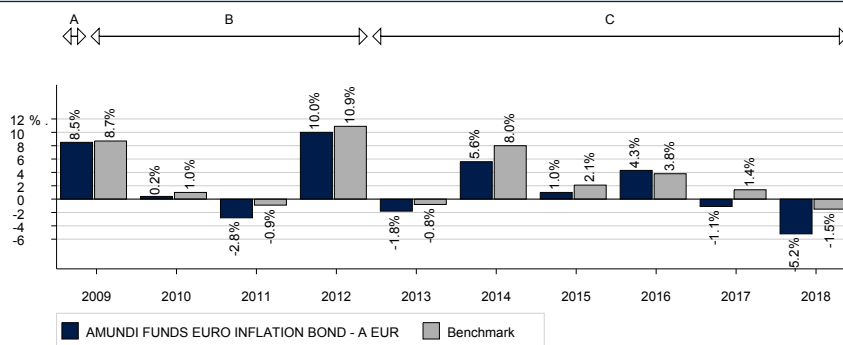
The **ongoing charges** figure is based on expenses for the current year. This figure may vary from year to year. It excludes:
